



Practice Guidelines

- All mounted shooting arenas (and/or fields) must be approved by a current CCMSA certified Range Master prior to the commencement of ANY mounted shooting activity.
- All practices are to be announced 24 hours in advance or as soon as possible to admin@canadianmountedshooters.com and are to be approved by a CCMSA Director/sanctioned CCMSA insurance.
- No person shall participate while under the influence of alcohol or other impairing substances. Zero tolerance is in effect. Violations will result in expulsion from the CCMSA.
- No live ammunition on site.
- Safety is paramount. Courses will be developed and executed in a manner that allows for the safe discharge of firearms.
- At the start of the event, check each other's guns to make sure they are empty and safe to load. At the end of the event ensure firearms have been unloaded.
- The course of fire shall not be engaged until it is clear and safe to do so.
- All mounted participants and their equine partner must have completed a CCMSA certification clinic or be approved by a designate of the club to be eligible to participate.
- Firearms shall not be left unattended at any time.
- Only the use of fg or equivalent black powder blank ammunition shall be used.
- A log book of attending members must be kept. Date, location, names, and signatures must be recorded. The log book shall be submitted to the CCMSA Secretary from time to time as required.
- One CCMSA members in good standing must be present to hold the practice. Participants must be accompanied by a safety designate over 18 years of age.

- Any injuries or safety violations must be reported to the CCMSA within 12 hours of occurrence.
- All participants must have a PAL (Possession Acquisition Licence), Restricted firearms licence.
